Introduction



Our country gives special awards to people who have done something important.



The awards are called 'honours'.

You can suggest someone to receive an honour if you think they deserve it.



This information explains:

 how to suggest someone and tell us about them



what happens next



The group of experts decide which people receive an honour twice a year.

Suggesting someone for an honour



You can suggest anyone to receive an honour.



But you cannot suggest yourself.



The people who deserve an honour are people who have:

made a difference through their hard work



helped our country



You should not tell people that you have told us you think they should get an honour.

How does someone get an honour?



You should suggest the person for an honour while they are still doing their good work.



To suggest them you must complete a 'nomination form'.

There is a nomination form at the back of this information, starting on page 15.



It is important that you provide as much information on the form as possible.

You can use extra sheets of paper if you need to.



You can also send more information later on, after you have sent the form you have filled in.

What to include on the nomination form



You need to tell us about:

what the person has done



how they have made a difference.



You should give examples of the good work they have done.



We want you to tell us:

 what the person has done for people who need help



about the work they have done for others, without pay



how they are different to other people



 how much other people respect them



 how they have managed to deal with difficult things.



Letters of support

Along with the nomination form, you will need to send us letters from 2 other people who say they agree with your suggestion.



Help with the form

We keep all the information on the forms safe and private.



If the person dies after you have suggested them, you must tell us. We cannot give honours to people who have died.

How long does it take?



We will write to you when we get your nomination form.



We check everything you have told us. This can take between 18 months and 2 years.



Not everyone who is suggested gets an honour.



Honours are given to people:

in the new year



on the King's birthday



If the person you tell us about has not been given an honour after 2 years, it means they have not been successful.



You can tell us about them again, if they have done more good work.

Awards for organisations



The King's Award for Voluntary Service is an award that can be given to an organisation that has done a lot of voluntary work for its community.






- Community work in Aberporth.



Please tell us:

- What roles the person has had.
- What dates they started and finished each role.
- Whether they got paid for their work.



Please tell us how the person has helped other people.

Please tell us if the person has received other awards, or been in the news.

Please send us photos and cuttings from newspapers if you have them.
